



# ASP Returns To Hibernian Hall With August Wilson's *King Hedley II*

(BOSTON) – Following one of ASP's most acclaimed and successful productions of all-time, *Seven Guitars*, Actors' Shakespeare Project returns to Hibernian Hall in March for another installment in August Wilson's American Century Cycle: *King Hedley II*, directed by Elliot Norton Award winner Summer L. Williams.

Fresh off of a seven-year stint in prison, King Hedley II (named after his father, who was played by Johnnie Mack in ASP's *Seven Guitars*) dreams of going straight. He's going to open his own video store — even if he has to steal every refrigerator in Pittsburgh to make it happen. Returning home to the Hill District in 1985, King finds that his community is beset by violence, con men, and redlining. As King fights to keep his family afloat, the harsh realities of Reagan's America threaten to drag him under.

"We're thrilled to be partnering with Hibernian Hall again on another masterpiece by August Wilson," says Artistic Director Christopher V. Edwards. "As an itinerant theatre company, we have a unique ability to bring high-quality and intimate theatre to all corners of Boston, and we've always been welcomed so graciously and enthusiastically when we perform in Roxbury."

**August Wilson** is one of the the most lauded American playwrights of the twentieth century, known particularly for his American Century Cycle - a series of ten plays that examine the African diaspora and Black life in the United States from the 1900s to the 1990s. All ten were produced on Broadway, and garnered Wilson ten Tony nominations as well as the Tony Award for Best Play (*Fences*), two Tony Awards for Best Revival (*Fences, Jitney*), and two Pulitzer Prizes for Drama (*Fences, The Piano Lesson*). On October 16, 2005, Broadway renamed the theater located at 245 West 52nd Street, The August Wilson Theatre. In August of 2022, Wilson's childhood home in Pittsburgh was reopened to the public as a historic landmark and artistic cultural center. He has been heralded by many as "The American Shakespeare."

*King Hedley II* features ASP Resident Artist Company member Omar Robinson, as well as Naheem Garcia, Brandon G. Green, Patrice Jean-Baptiste, James Ricardo Milord, and Karimah Williams.

The design team will feature Jon Savage (scenic), Becca Jewett (costumes), Anshuman Bhatia (lighting), Caroline Eng (sound), Saskia Martínez (props), and Olivia Dumaine (intimacy). Jake Mariño is Production Stage Manager, and Athéna-Gwendolyn Baptiste is Assistant Stage Manager.

*King Hedley II* will run for four weeks, from March 8-31, 2024 at Hibernian Hall (184 Dudley St., Roxbury, MA 02119). It will be produced in partnership with Hibernian Hall.

# PRODUCTION HISTORY

*King Hedley II* had its world premiere at the Pittsburgh Public Theater in December 1999, and debuted in Boston at the Huntington Theatre Company in May 2000. It opened on Broadway the following year at the Virginia Theatre (now the August Wilson Theatre), where it ran for seventy-two performances and received six Tony Award nominations. It was also nominated for the 2000 Pulitzer Prize for Drama.

# ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT

**August Wilson** (Playwright) authored *Gem of the Ocean, Joe Turner's Come and Gone, Ma Rainey's Black Bottom, The Piano Lesson, Seven Guitars, Fences, Two Trains Running, Jitney, King Hedley II,* and *Radio Golf.* The ten play compilation is entitled The American Century Cycle. These works explore the heritage and experience of the descendants of Africans brought to North America as slaves, decade-by-decade, over the course of the twentieth century. Each of the Wilson plays have been produced on Broadway, at theaters across the country, and all over the world. In 2003, Wilson made his professional stage debut in his one-man show, *How I Learned What I Learned*.

His works garnered many awards including two Pulitzer Prizes for Drama (*Fences* in 1987 and *The Piano Lesson* in 1990), the 1987 Tony Award for Best Play (*Fences*), two Tony Awards for Best Revival of a Play (*Fences* in 2010 and *Jitney* in 2017), the 2002 Olivier Award for Best New Play (*Jitney*), the 2017 Olivier Award for Best Revival of a Play (*Ma Rainey's Black Bottom*), and seven Drama Critics Circle Awards. Additionally, the cast recording of *Ma Rainey's Black Bottom* received a 1985 Grammy Award, and Wilson received a 1995 Emmy Award nomination for his screenplay adaptation of *The Piano Lesson*.

During his life, Wilson received many fellowships and awards, including the Rockefeller and Guggenheim Fellowships in Playwriting, the Whiting Writers Award, the Heinz Award, and was awarded the 1999 National Humanities Medal by President Bill Clinton. He received numerous honorary degrees from colleges and universities, as well as the only high school diploma ever issued by the Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh. Wilson's now famous TCG speech, <u>The Ground on Which I Stand</u> in 1996 triggered a great debate in the world of the American Theater.

On October 16, 2005, Broadway renamed the theater located at 245 West 52nd Street, The August Wilson Theatre. New York Public Radio recorded the entire American Century Cycle at the Greene Space, casting many of the original Broadway actors. PBS aired a documentary on Wilson entitled, "The Ground On Which I Stand," as part of the American Masters series. Wilson's screenplay for the 2017 feature film, *Fences* starring Denzel Washington and Viola Davis, garnered him an Academy Award nomination. Recently, The August Wilson African American Cultural Center in Pittsburgh opened a permanent exhibit under its roof, solely dedicated to the playwright's artistic legacy. In August of 2022, Wilson's childhood home in Pittsburgh was reopened to the public as a historic landmark and artistic cultural center, and his full archives now being housed at Pittsburgh University.

Though born in Pittsburgh, Wilson resided in Seattle when he passed away in 2005. He is survived by his daughters, Sakina Ansari Wilson and Azula Carmen Wilson, and his wife, costume designer, and Executive Director of the August Wilson Legacy LLC, Constanza Romero-Wilson. (*he/him*)
