(BOSTON) – Actors' Shakespeare Project is proud to announce three blockbuster mainstage titles for their 2024-25 Season, each from one of the most celebrated writers in the English language: Jane Austen, August Wilson, and William Shakespeare.

"As we commemorate ASP's 20th Anniversary this October – marking two decades since our first performance of *Richard III* at the Old South Meeting House in 2004 – we know these three productions will display what our company does best," said Artistic Director Christopher V. Edwards. "I'm excited to be working alongside my long-time colleagues Regine Vital and Maurice Parent in celebrating and challenging the place of these plays among the literary canon."

In November 2024: Actors' Shakespeare Project kicks off their twenty-first season with Kate Hamill's adaptation of one of the most beloved novels in the English language: Jane Austen's *Emma*. Directed by ASP Associate Producer Regine Vital and staged at The Multicultural Arts Center in East Cambridge, this rollicking romantic comedy will charm theatergoers of all ages.

In January 2025: Actors' Shakespeare Project continues their partnership with Hibernian Hall in bringing the American Century Cycle of August Wilson to Roxbury. Following the runaway success of *Seven Guitars* and *King Hedley II*, ASP Artistic Director Christopher V. Edwards will helm Wilson's Pulitzer Prize-winning epic *The Piano Lesson*.

In April 2025: Actors' Shakespeare Project makes their first foray into Watertown with **A Midsummer Night's Dream**! Elliot Norton Award-winning director and ASP Resident Artist Maurice Emmanuel Parent's invigorating new take will explore the beauty and romance, but also the sinister underbelly, of one of Shakespeare's most beloved comedies.

Tickets for all performances range from \$59 to \$64, with a limited allotment of \$20 tickets for all performances, subject to availability. Student tickets are \$25, available for any patron ages 25 and under. Discount tickets are also available through the EBT Card to Culture program, presented through Mass Cultural Council.

ABOUT THE DIRECTORS

CHRISTOPHER V. EDWARDS (Director - *The Piano Lesson*) is a director, actor, fight choreographer, educator and consultant. He is currently the Artistic Director of Actors' Shakespeare Project in Boston, where he has directed *The Taming of the Shrew, Let The Right One In, The Bomb-itty of Errors, The Complete Works of William Shakespeare (Abridged), Pride & Prejudice, Equivocation,* and *Much Ado About Nothing.* He also is appearing as Lord Capulet in ASP's upcoming production of *Romeo and Juliet.*

Prior to ASP, he was the Artistic Director of Nevada Conservatory Theatre in Las Vegas and the Associate Artistic Director with The Hudson Valley Shakespeare Festival in New York. Chris was the founding Artistic Director for Point of Entry Theatre in NYC.

Chris has worked as a director and/or actor in London's West End, Off-Broadway, The National Theatre of Oslo in Norway, John Houseman's The Acting Company in NYC, HERE Arts Center, Dorset Theatre Festival, Edinburgh Fringe Festival, The Helix in Ireland, Chicago Shakespeare Theater, Ubu Rep, The Flea Theater, Cleveland Playhouse, The NY Hip-Hop Theatre Festival, Utah Shakespeare Festival, SOHO Rep, Penumbra Theater, Cincinnati Shakespeare Company, PA Shakes, Shakespeare and Company and Guthrie Theatre to name a few.

He is a Senior Lecturer at Boston University School of Theatre and received his MFA from the University of Minnesota in Association with the Guthrie Theatre. Chris lives in Jamaica Plain with his wife and daughter, Jennifer Rohn and Anya Edwards. (*he/him*)

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MAURICE EMMANUEL PARENT (Director - *A Midsummer Night's Dream*) is an award-winning actor, director, educator and mentor with twenty years of professional experience, and has been a Resident Artist at Actors' Shakespeare Project since 2011. He has over forty acting credits at theaters across the nation and abroad, having performed with some of Boston's oldest and most respected companies such as the Huntington Theatre Company, Commonwealth Shakespeare Company, SpeakEasy Stage Company, Lyric Stage Company, New Repertory Theatre, Boston Playwrights' Theater and Central Square Theater.

Maurice is the most recent recipient of the Elliot Norton Award for Outstanding Director of a Play (Midsize) for Actors' Shakespeare Project's 2023 production of *Seven Guitars*. His work as an actor has earned him two Elliot Norton Awards from The Boston Theater Critics Association, three IRNE awards, and an ArtsImpulse Award. Parent's history as an educator extends back over a decade. He has taught for Northeastern University, MIT, The Boston Conservatory at Berklee, and spent six years as a Performing Arts Specialist in the Boston Public School System. Currently, Parent is a full time Professor of the Practice in the Tufts Department of Theatre, Dance, and Performance Studies.

Parent is the co-founder of The Front Porch Arts Collective, a Black theatre company committed to advancing racial equity in Boston through theater. In its sixth season, The Porch has quickly become a well-respected voice in the Boston theatrical landscape. In residence at the Huntington Theatre Company, Parent serves as both Co-Producing Artistic Director of The Porch and Consulting Producer for The Huntington. (*he/him*)

REGINE VITAL (Director - *Emma*) is a storyteller, theatre artist, educator and current Associate Producer at Actors' Shakespeare Project. Most recently, she directed Wheelock Family Theatre's *A Wrinkle in Time*, and she has appeared onstage in ASP's productions of *As You Like It* (Celia) and *Seven Guitars* (Louise).

As an actor, director, dramaturg, teaching artist, and coach, she has worked with several theatre companies, programs, and schools. She teaches performance studies, composition, literature, and public speaking at Boston area universities; text and performance to high school and middle school students; and has taught continuing adult education classes in literature. A hometown girl from Somerville, MA, she is the previous Manager of Curriculum and Instruction at The Huntington.

Actors' Shakespeare Project is thrilled to continue and deepen our dedication to August Wilson's American Century Cycle with one of his most celebrated titles: *The Piano Lesson*. This passionate and riveting family drama returns to Pittsburgh's Hill District in the aftermath of The Great Depression.

Tensions are crackling under the floorboards of Doaker Charles' household when his fast-talking nephew Boy Willie blows in from Mississippi with a scheme to set their descendants up for generations. The plan: sell the family's ornate antique piano carved by an enslaved ancestor and use it to buy the land where his ancestors were enslaved.
